Course	The name of the programme is called the The Study Semester Abroad Scholarship. It's called a scholarship because the cost of the programme is approximately 40% less than the normal international price for partner universities
Restricted Course	Students can choose modules from most courses. There are a few courses that are restricted where courses only have 1 year long modules which are not possible to take over a semester period. Students take 2 modules x 30 credit modules

Credits required to come	The partner university can decide academic suitability for the programme however they must have completed at least one year of study at the partner university
Credits on completion	Students take 3 modules per semester. Each module involves 200 hours of study (class time and self directed study) Each module students gain 20 credits from so over a semester students gain 60 credits. Partner universities can choose how many credits to award for their home degree based on the calculation above
