Academic GPA	Minimum 2.6 out of 4.0.
English Language	<p>IELTS (Academic): 6.0 (with minimum 5.5 in each component).</p> <p>TOEFL iBT: 75 (Listening 17, Reading 18, Speaking 20, Writing 20). Other forms of TOEFL are not acceptable.</p> <p>Duolingo: 105 (Listening 95, Reading 100, Speaking 95, Writing 95). Or other equivalent.</p> <p>See below for further details.</p>
Pre-Sessional Language Course	<p>Students who have achieved IELTS 5.5 may take a non-credit bearing, 5-week pre-sessional online English course prior to undergraduate study. This is only available to students starting in Semester One (September) and is not currently running in Semester Two (February).</p> <p>The course is subject to availability; please contact us for further details.</p>
Completed Study	Although not mandatory, we do recommend that students have completed at least one semester at their home university before applying to study abroad with York St John University.

Study requirements	Students need to complete 60 York St John credits per semester. This is equal to 30 ECTS.

Please note that if The Grange and Limes Court are full, students may be housed in more expensive accommodation sites (up to approximately £190 per week).</p>

Dates	<p>Semester One: September - January Semester Two: February - June Full Year: September – June (Please note that full year is available from September only, and not from February)</p> <p>All teaching for Semester One will finish before Christmas, and alternative assessments can be arranged for those who need to leave by Christmas to return for early January semester start dates at home.</p> <p>Our Academic dates York St John University (yorksj.ac.uk).</p>
Nomination	<p>Please complete our nominations form by: 15th April (September entry) 15th October (February entry)</p>
Application	<p>Following receipt of all nominations we will email nominated students a link to the online application form with a guidance document. This will be emailed to students by: 17th April (September entry) 17th October (February entry)</p> <p>The deadlines for students to then submit applications are: 30th April (September entry) 31st October (February entry)</p>
Application Documents	<p>All Students: Colour copy of passport (photo ID page-this must be valid until 6 months after the end of the exchange) and a copy of their current academic record/transcript in English.</p> <p>Non-EU/EEA students: Certified Evidence of English Language Level. E.G. IELTS (Academic) 6.0 (with no less than 5.5 in each component) or equivalent.</p> <p>EU/EEA students: Letter from home institution confirming B2 level of English.</p> <p>Please note: We do accept the Abitur qualification as proof of English language level. This would need to be an overall core of 3.2 or lower and the English Language grade will need to be 10.</p>
